We have contracted with Export Floral to handle our flower orders. The chancel flowers remain \$50. If the vases are already ordered, you can order an organ arrangement for \$20.

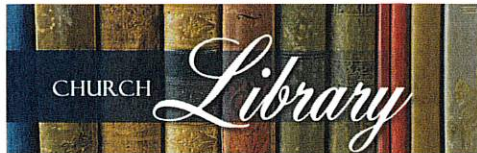

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows individuals aged 70 ½ or older to make tax-free donations to the church or other qualified charities directly from their IRA which also counts towards their required minimum distributions (RMDs). THE NICENE CREED

- 1.1 We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is,
seen and unseen.
- 1.2 We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and became truly human.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.
- 1.3 We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

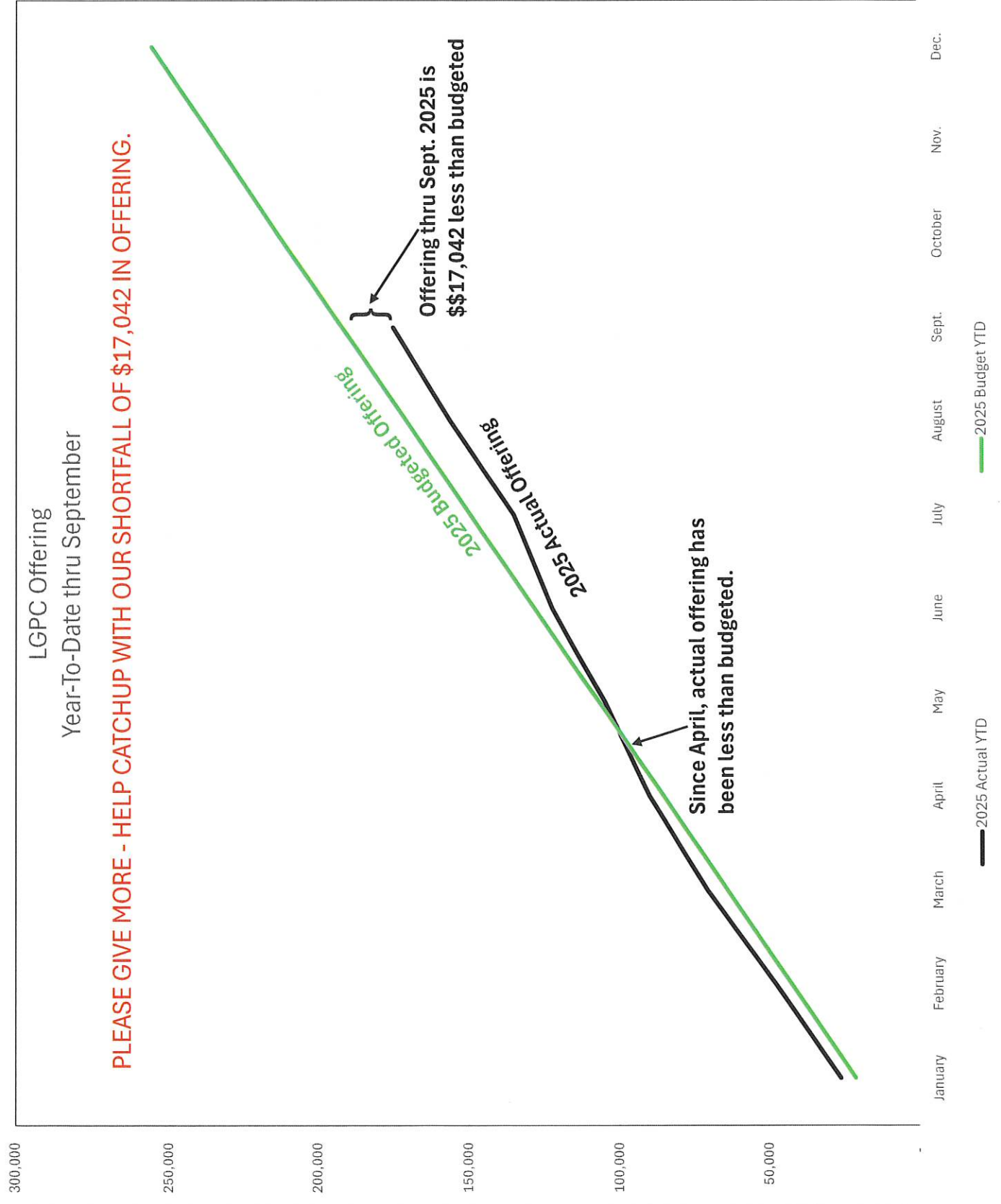
Please give the names of any families you think could benefit from a basket to Rev. Rach or to the church office very soon. All information about the families is kept confidential.

CONSECRATION SUNDAY

NOVEMBER 23RD

Dear Level Green Church Family,

Thanksgiving is rapidly approaching with Christmas close behind. God has even more good things planned for our future. Looking at the past, can you even count God's blessings?

On **Sunday November 23rd** during **Consecration Sunday** our church will gather to Worship God and make our personal financial commitment to support the work of Jesus Christ done through Level Green Church. We submit our estimate of Giving card as a commitment to God.

Without your Estimate of Giving cards, our budget is a "best guess" (with God's guidance). We each have a responsibility to think and pray about the financial commitment we will make to the Church of Jesus Christ in 2026.

We pray about our lives and the lives of our children and grandchildren, and we pray for the chaotic world in which we live. Will Level Green Church continue to be a positive influence on our families, friends, and neighbors? Will their relationship with Christ grow? Will Level Green Church fade away, and in its absence leave a world that is less Christ-like? Your financial commitment can help Level Green Church be a beacon of Light now, and in the future.

How you respond will affect the future of Level Green Church in many ways!

- With inflation, we need more contributions just to maintain the status quo.
- Churches around the world are shrinking - fewer people are contributing for God's work.
- Will we be able to keep staff members? Can we adequately compensate them?
- How much mission work will we be able to do in our community and in the world?

Our expenses in 2024 were \$318,188 and will be approximately \$312,000 in 2025. We have reduced expenses, but Offering has also reduced: \$240,119 in 2024 and forecasted to be \$232,000 in 2025. We need to increase our Offering and continue to manage expenses.

The Bible has a lot to say about money! Three "Biblical Principles of Giving" to consider:

- ALL that we have belongs to God and He entrusts us with it, to use it as He wants us to use it. God trusts us to be faithful in the use of His money.
- GIVING, first and foremost, is "OUR RESPONSE" to what God has done for us through Jesus Christ. It is a way of THANKING God for all the ways that He has blessed us!
- **GOD ASKS US TO GIVE IN PROPORTION TO WHAT WE HAVE RECEIVED...** Not just a part of what is left over after paying for vacations, Christmas and birthday presents, golf, movies, etc. If we are blessed with much ...our giving should be large.

Something to consider when filling in your Estimate of Giving card: Could each of us increase our giving in 2026 by “only” 4%? It would mean a great deal for what our church could accomplish in 2026, and beyond. Examples of a 4% increase:

- Those giving \$10 per week would increase by only 40 cents – to \$10.40 per week.
- People giving \$50 per week would increase by just \$2.00 – to \$52.00 per week.
- Those giving \$100 per week would increase by only \$4 – to \$104.00 per week.
- Giving an additional 4% (or more) will make a large difference in the life of our church.

For Consecration Sunday on November 23rd, please prayerfully consider what God asks you to do in response to the many blessings He has provided, and please respond with a generous commitment. God calls you to give – not just what we feel comfortable contributing after we spend on our earthly wants and needs.

Included below is a “**Commitment Card**” (**Estimate of Giving card**). Cards will also be available during our November 9th and 16th worship services. If possible, we ask that you plan to present your Card to God during one of the worship services on November 23rd - Consecration Sunday. Otherwise, please return your card by placing it in an offering plate or by returning it to the church office.

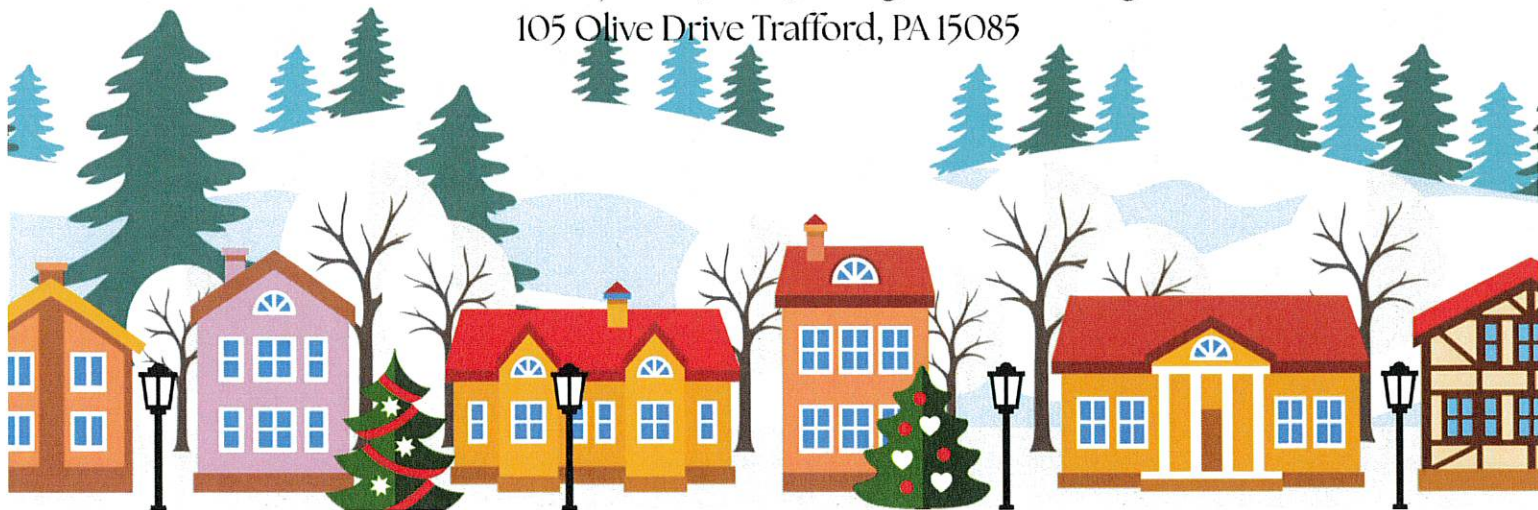

- ☐ if communion, collect and discard cups from pews,
- ☐ call someone to fill in for you if you can't make your assigned date.

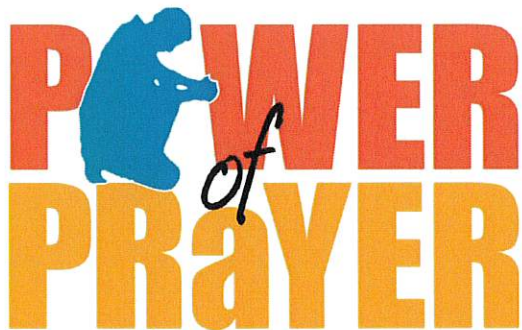
